

### Utilitarianism definition

Bring the greatest good to the greatest number Increases net happiness—or decrease net unhappiness—when everyone is taken into account, projected into the future

Example (v Kant): A madman claims to hate people names "Jane." He corners you and demands your name, which happens to be Jane. Now what?

# How calculate utilitarian happiness?


Idealistic: Maximize sensations of happiness as intellectual life and culture (Mill)

Hedonistic: Maximize sensations of happiness as carnal pleasure (Bentham)


Monetized: Reduction of happiness / sadness to monetary values



Trolley problem (and the problem of moral distance...)





# Ford Pinto dilemma and monetized social wellbeing

### Benefit to society

```
180 deaths avoided per year x $200,000 per death (discounted future earnings) = $36,000,000/year
```

180 injuries avoided per year x \$67,000 per injury = \$12,060,000/year

2,100 destroyed vehicles avoided per year x \$700 per vehicle = \$1,470,000/year

Total = \$49,530,000/year

### Costs to society (if ALL cars with this problem were fixed/re-engineered)

12,500,000 vehicles per year subject to the new standard x \$11 per vehicle = \$137,500,000/year

Ford calculated that the rollover standard would cost society almost three times more to implement than it would benefit society.

# VERSIONS OF UTILITARIAN REGULATION

### Soft utilitarianism

Act recommendable if increases net happiness (or decreases net unhappiness) when everyone taken into account

### Hard utilitarianism

Act recommendable if it increases net happiness (or decreases net unhappiness) when everyone is taken into account, more than any other possible act

### Act utilitarianism

Act is recommendable if it increases net happiness (or decreases net unhappiness) when everyone is taken into account

### Rule utilitarianism

A rule for action is recommended if collective obedience to the rule increases net happiness when everyone is taken into account

Action's consequences increase net happiness (or decrease net unhappiness) when everything is taken into account *except the actor's increased or diminished happiness*

# Google shared AI knowledge with the world — until ChatGPT caught up

For years the tech giant published scientific research that helped jump-start its competitors. But now it's lurched into defensive mode.



But the launch of OpenAI's groundbreaking ChatGPT three months earlier had changed things. The San Francisco start-up kept up with Google by reading the team's scientific papers, Dean said at the quarterly meeting for the company's research division. Indeed, transformers — a foundational part of the latest AI tech and the T in ChatGPT — originated in a Google study.

Things had to change. Google would take advantage of its own AI discoveries, sharing papers only after the lab work had been turned into products, Dean said, according to two people with knowledge of the meeting, who spoke on the condition of anonymity to share private information.

### EGOISM DEFINITION

- 1. Chat GPT What is egoism?
- 2. Definition: Mirrors altruism
  Action's consequences increase net happiness
  (or decrease net unhappiness) when everything
  is taken into account exclusively for the actor's
  increased or diminished happiness

Happiness calculation & consequentialism: Lying, cheating, stealing not count in happiness calculation, only results

# Rules of egoism (Personal/Impersonal)

### Personal egoism

Practicing an ethics of egoism without regard for what others are doing or should do

### Impersonal egoism

The belief that everyone should practice ethical of egoism (Invisible hand argument)

# Rules of egoism (Rational/Psychological)

### Rational egoism

Subscribe to egoism because reasonable ethical theory: what a perfectly rational person would choose (v Kant)

- If don't look out for myself, no one will.
- "O te chingas, o te chingan"
- Doing well for me helps others too.

### Psychological egoism

Belief that we're all necessarily egoists; it's an inescapable part of what it means to be human


• Mother Teresa sees reward - heaven.



#### 1. Chat GPT

### 2. Definition

Egoism after the premise that benefitting others - acting to increase their happiness - can serve the egoist's self-interest more than acting directly in favor of themself

Invisible hand: Force of marketplace competition encourages/requires individuals to help others by helping themselves


